2018/212	To receive a report from the Police Sergeant Andy Burfoot introduced himself and Paul Matthews. There is a fresh start in the team with 2 other new Sergeants. PCSO Steve Phillipson is also part of the Nailsworth team and will start working out of Nailsworth so that he always starts and finishes his shift here. Crime statistics have reduced compared to this time last year especially in burglaries and criminal damage. Going forward the Police are focusing on parks and open spaces. There was a question session during which the following points were raised: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Increased waiting times for the 101 service? This is supposed to decrease the burden on the officers. • Will there be volunteer police helpers in the future? Not aware of, they have very good 'specials' and there is an increase in the precept to help staffing levels. • How to report crime? There is a constabulary internet page to report non-urgent items. If a crime is in progress – call 999. • CCTV: disappointed that it has been removed from the Town without our being informed.

Completely remove the lowest 'hooked' limb over the fence and the next 2 branches above this. Reduce the crown spread all round to leave it no longer than 2.5m long from the main stem. Remove / stabilise 6 or 7 branches with possible historic 'hazard beam' fractures. (2) Next tree on the left. Remove / stabilise approximately 9 or 10 branches with possible historic 'hazard beam' fractures.</p>
