  - a) S.19/0374/HHOLD. Abbeyfield House, Barn Close, Nailsworth, Stroud. Demolition of extension at rear, internal alterations, conversion and alteration of adjoining building to create annexe

Suggest pollard down to 4 metres and either manage the regrowth on a pollard cycle or if the tree does not reshoot, retain for standing deadwood

It was **recommended** to make good the land at Ragnall Lane (encroachment issue) and to install wooden bollards or a bund (long, low mound) along the edge and to advise by letter to the residents that this is happening. To remove the fly tipping and flail.  
It was **recommended** to take legal action against the resident for encroachment



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should the problem persist

It was **recommended** to develop a full and properly costed proposal for provision of parking along Meadowbank and to clear brambles and fly tipping, to bring the land back into regular maintenance as informal grassland.

It was **recommended** to submit a proposal to SDC's Tourism Promotion Fund for a contribution to costs of the Civic Centre project.

It was **recommended** to refer the future location of the Town Archive to the Civic Centre working party as part of Stream 1 of that project and that the Civic Centre working party forms a steering group with the Archive Team to involve them.
