There's a possibility of another link up for Nailsworth, in an informal twinning arrangement with a town in New York State USA. Perry, a town of 4,600 people about 2 hours from Niagara Falls, came to our attention when the Mayor Rick Hauser visited Nailsworth on holiday with his family and liked it so much he came back the following year.



He met Nailsworth Mayor Jonathan Duckworth, who then reciprocated by visiting Perry in August 2017 when he was on a trip to see the Total Eclipse of the Sun.



Jonathan was very taken with the quiet town, and its recently opened craft brewery. He and Rick have had this idea for an informal twinning arrangement, sharing ideas and experiences, but not necessarily requiring formal visits. There's a particular event coming up that might interest visitors to Perry though; on April 8th 2024, there is another total eclipse over the USA and Perry is right in the path. Jonathan says "I'll be there, it is such a magical experience, and the eclipse will be fun too..."

Perry is a town in Wyoming County, New York. The population was 4,616 at the 2010 census. The town is named after Commodore Oliver Hazard Perry.

The Town of Perry is on the eastern border of the county. Perry is also the name of a village within the town.

U.S. Route 20A passes across the town.
