VISIT TO LÈVES FOR THE REMEMBRANCE OF THE 100TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE ENDING OF WW1





On a very wet Friday evening, myself, Daphne, Bruce and Sue (Fenn) set out to drive to Newhaven to stay in a Premier Inn prior to catching the Ferry to Dieppe the following day. We were thankful that the bad weather had

abated, and we arrived in France on time at 3.00pm.

We arrived in Lèves at about 6.30pm, a little late; we had told our hosts ETA 6.00pm. This was due to my asking to go a different route via Anet for old times sake, which was a bit of a mistake as by now it was quite dark.

Daphne and myself were staying with Francois and Nicole Dauvillier, Bruce and Sue were being hosted by Roger and Jannick Moreau.

Sunday 11th November dawned very wet and windy. The Service of Remembrance was in the Eglise St. Lazare, starting at 10.00am, where I was invited to read one of the bible readings. As we were celebrating the ending of WW1 100 years ago, the Service was interspersed with music from "l'école de musique", so a slightly different format to previous ones.

After, we all assembled with the congregation, residents of Lèves and the Town Band to walk to the Cemetery. Bruce was carrying the Royal British Legion Flag and at the Cemetery Allan laid the Poppy Wreath. The names of the fallen were read out and the two National Athems played.

We then proceeded to the Ecole for drinks and a speech by the Mayor, Rémi Martial.

At 1.00pm we were seated in the Espace Soutine for the Banquet, which is provided for the Veterans and

their Widows.

On Monday with better weather, we all visited Chartres, myself and Daphne then joining Michel and Marie Fruchard for lunch, Bruce and Sue catching up with Philippe and Odile Vanneau.

Our journey home on Tuesday was uneventful and we thank our hosts for making us so welcome, as they always do. In conclusion, a very pleasant week-end. Allan.



The gardening team did an autumn tidy up of the flower beds recently, clocking up another 3 hours 45 minutes of volunteering for the Association. This brings our total for the year so far to just over 660 hours / 82 working days approx.

Bulbs and polyanthus were planted for the spring as well as chopping and weeding to make the area look cared for. A new tree is also due to be planted to replace the now dead 20th anniversary cherry tree (mark II) at the bottom of Spring Hill. We've taken some advice and the new tree will be a Rowan (Mountain Ash) which we hope will be more robust and suited to the area.
