It is a bright, open and inviting space and a credit to all involved. • Acorn School are holding a talk next Wednesday (guest Liz Bonning) about plastic in the environment. Cllr Jonathan Duckworth has been invited and there is room for another guest if anyone would like to attend. • Cllr Steve Robinson discussed how the Christmas lights in the Mortimer Garden tree were not working. The Deputy Clerk explained that SP Electrical have repaired them this week. • Cllr Sally Millett is concerned about the beginning of ASB again. Cllr Steve Robinson suggested there have been some isolated incidents but no problems in the Town Centre. He does however have concerns regarding the Aston Project. It was confirmed that someone from the Neighbourhood Policing Team will attend the next meeting on the 22nd January where these issues can be addressed. • Cllr Mike Kelly explained that he and Danny will be in the Stroud News & Journal this week regarding being refused entrance into 3 premises/shops.
